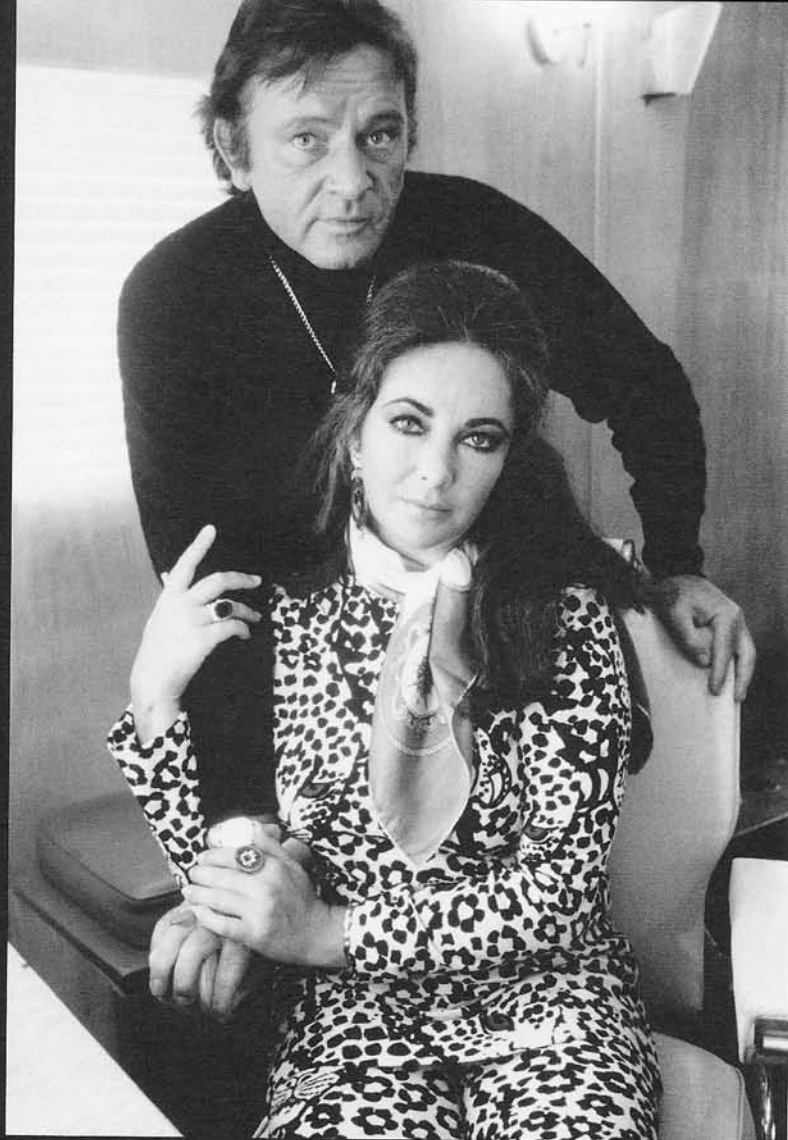


## Shooting stars

**Terry O'Neill has been photographing celebrities for more than 50 years. One of the greatest British photographers of the 20th century, he has helped define the notion of "celebrity" as it is today.**

This September, The Little Black Gallery is bringing together a selection of these famous faces in an exhibition entitled *It Girls and Boys*.

The display includes a selection of previously unseen photographs alongside well known images such as O'Neill's iconic shot of a windswept Brigitte Bardot smoking a cigar.

Formal portraits of power couples like Richard Burton and Elizabeth Taylor sit along side candid snapshots of Twiggy,

Goldie Hawn, Britt Ekland and Peter Sellers – the type of images that were the bread and butter of O'Neill's career.

Stars of the 1960s are well accounted for and elsewhere in the show you'll find Ursula Andress, Jean Shrimpton, the Rolling Stones and Frank Sinatra, who O'Neill shadowed on and off for almost three decades.

"Working with Sinatra was one of the highlights of my life," O'Neill has said in the past. "He was a great man, the sort who made you feel good to be a man."
